Biographical/historical note:

This Bulkley family descended from Thomas, Daniel and Peter who settled in Fairfield in the middle 1600s. Their ancestors became farmers, store owners, lacksmiths, seamen, politicians, shipping merchants and ship owners. Eleazer Bulkley (1763-1843) and later his sons were successfully engaged in shipping in New York and Southport, Connecticut. Scope and content note:

This collection consists of legal, financial, and shipping papers from various members of the Bulkley family. Box 1 contains deeds by date, probate papers, writs (organized by date), legal papers, and bills (in alphabetical order). Box 2 holds shipping bills, financial records and correspondence. The most notable letters are those between

Francis Sayre and his sister Jane Sayre Bulkley and her husband, Uriah Bulkley. The shipping papers include bills of lading and manifests. Boxes 3-5 contain account books and diaries. Shipping books are arranged in Boxes 6 and 7. The oversize items consist of account books and bank check books.
