Biographical/historical note:

Emma Starr Nichols (1874-1947) was the daughter of Finette Edwards Benson and John Nichols, and the sister of Fairfield politician Finette Benson Nichols. She lived in the "Benson Tavern" on the corner of South Benson Road and Old Post Road. Finette Nichols was the chairman of the Salvage Committee in Fairfield during World War II.

Scope and content note:

The scrapbook consists of newspaper clippings Emma Nichols collected to document the work of the Salvage Committee of the Fairfield Defense Council between 1942-1943. Salvaged items included metal, newspaper, fat, phonograph records, rags, and rubber.
