Daughters of the American Revolution, Eunice Dennie Burr Chapter represents one of the most complete record groups in the collection. This chapter was incorporated in 1925 and the articles of association are among the records. Minutes of both local board and regular meetings from the organization's founding in 1894 to 1959, are included. Annual historical reports documenting the group's interests and activities are part of the minutes. Registrar's files encompass genealogical materials used to prove ancestry necessary to gain entry into the DAR, working papers and correspondence. Also included are members' letters of resignation resulting from the organization's refusal to let Marian Anderson sing at a DAR function at Constitution Hall in Washington DC.

The papers of the Greenfield Country Club are scanty with bulk dates from 1901-1907. A minute book (1901-1907) documents the association's organization and early years. Programs and postcards (1903-1911) pertain to various social activities initiated by the club.

The Greenfield Country Club, formed in 1901, was an agricultural and artistic endeavor. The property was bought in 1925 and turned into an eighteen hole golf course which failed in the early 40s.

Pequot Yacht Club was organized in November 1920. It replaced the "Bachelor's Comfort and Married Men's Retreat," which had been inactive for 50 years. Members included many wealthy Brideport and New York men. Unlike its predecessor, the Pequot Yacht Club was open to women. In 1926 it established classes in sailing for children and hosted races, activities in which the club is still involved today.

Materials in the collection were developed as part of the club's 75th anniversary celebration. The historical vignette depicting the clubs history stars Jason Robards, a local resident. The programs accompanied the initial showing of the videotape. The brochures are a "scrapbook" history of the yacht club using printed copies of photographs and newspaper clippings.

The membership handbook was donated by V. Louise Higgins in 1998.
