

Fairfield's Historic Town Green was first laid out in 1639 on the site of an ancient Native American campsite and for nearly 375 years it has been at the heart of Fairfield's original "four square" plan. Begin your exploration of this historic site at the introductory sign adjacent to the Fairfield Museum and History Center (1) and discover the hidden corners of Fairfield's fascinating past. 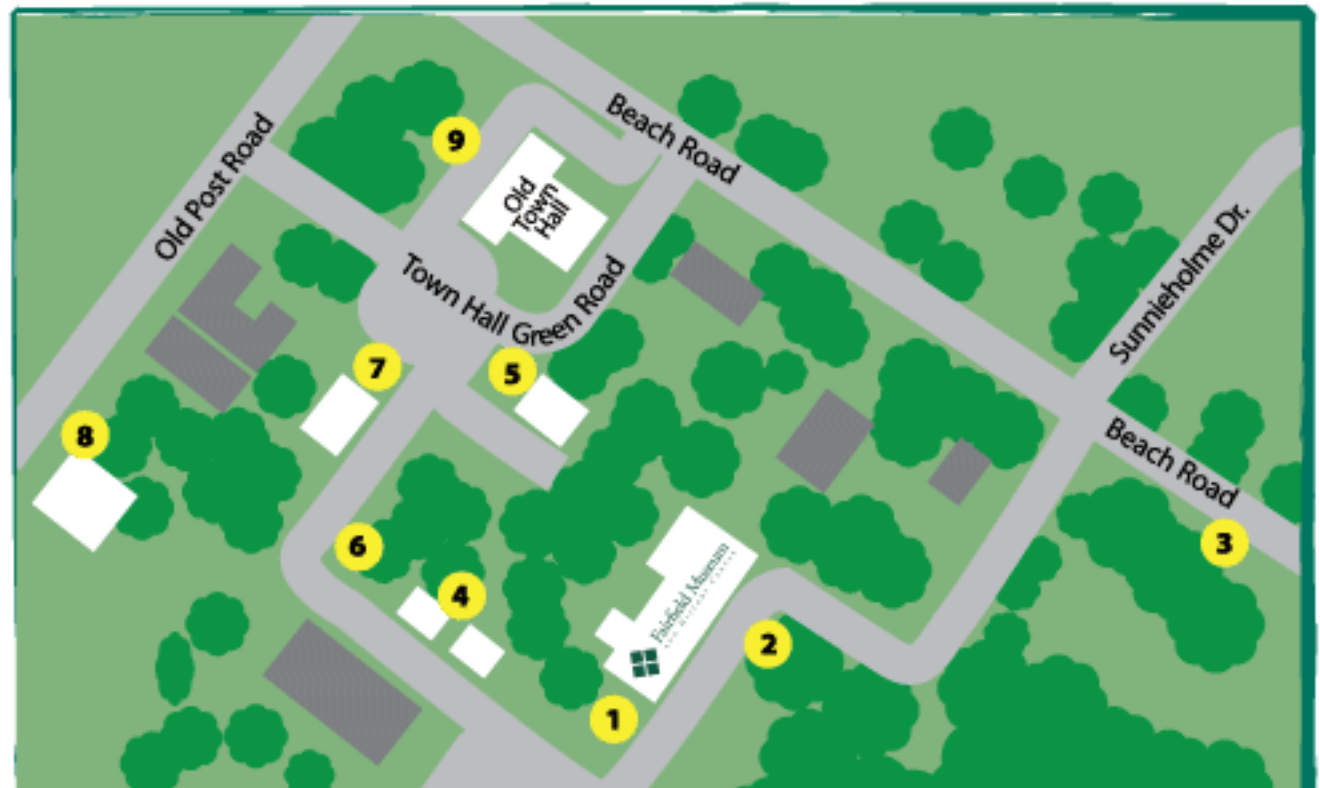
